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#### **Types of Tests**

## 1- Achievement tests

Achievement (attainment) tests are tests that are used to test how much a student has learnt of a learning syllabus. They test students' present knowledge as indicative of past learning.

- Achievement (attainment) tests are based on a course syllabus
- Achievement (attainment) tests are considered formal tests

Progress Tests: are tests given during the course of instruction to assess development.

# What are aims of using progress tests?

- 1. Stimulate learning
- 2. Reinforce what has been taught
- 3. Enable the teacher to be familiar with the work of each of his students and the whole class in general.

### 2- Proficiency tests

Proficiency tests are tests used to test students' global ability. They test students' present knowledge and ability for future learning.

- Proficiency tests are NOT based on any course syllabus
- An example of a proficiency test is TOEFL and IELTS

# What are aims of using proficiency tests?

- 1. Placing individuals in learning groups appropriate to their level of knowledge (beginner/ intermediate/ advanced)
- 2. Post-graduate studies
- 3. Getting a job

# What is the main difference between <u>Proficiency</u> and <u>achievement</u> tests?

Achievement tests are based on a course syllabus, while Proficiency tests are not based on a syllabus.
