In this lecture, students learn basic greetings and how to introduce themselves.

Key Vocabulary:

Hello, Hi, Good morning, Good afternoon, Good evening, Goodbye, Bye.

Introducing Yourself:

- My name is ...

- I am ...

- I'm a student.

- I'm from ...

Grammar Focus: Verb "to be" (I am)

Examples:

I am Ali.

I am a student.

I am from Iraq.

Practice:

Students practice short conversations introducing themselves.

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Lecture 2 – Verb To Be

The verb “to be” is one of the most important verbs in English.

Forms:

I am (I’m)

You are (You’re)

He is (He’s)

She is (She’s)

It is (It’s)

We are (We’re)

They are (They’re)

Examples:

She is a teacher.

They are students.

Negative:

I am not

He is not (isn’t)

They are not (aren’t)

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Lecture 3 – Personal Information

Students learn how to talk about personal information.

Topics:

Country, city, job, age.

Questions:

What is your name?

Where are you from?

How old are you?

Answers:

I am from Basra.

I am 18 years old.

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Lecture 4 – Possessive Adjectives (Unit 2)

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Lecture 4 – Possessive Adjectives

Possessive adjectives show ownership.

My, Your, His, Her, Its, Our, Their

Examples:

My book

Her name

Their house

Sentences:

This is my phone.

His name is Ahmed.

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Lecture 5 – Everyday Objects (Unit 3)

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Lecture 5 – Everyday Objects

Students learn vocabulary for classroom and daily objects.

Vocabulary:

Book, Pen, Bag, Phone, Table, Chair.

Grammar: This / That

This is a book.

That is a chair.

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Lecture 6 – Plurals and Numbers (Unit 3)

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Lecture 6 – Plurals and Numbers

Plural nouns:

Book → Books

Car → Cars

Bus → Buses

Numbers 1–100.

Examples:

Two books

Ten students

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Lecture 7 – Family and People (Unit 4)

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Lecture 7 – Family and People

Vocabulary:

Mother, Father, Brother, Sister, Friend.

Grammar: 's (possession)

Ali's book

Sara's phone

Examples:

This is my mother.

That is Ali's brother.

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Lecture 8 – Daily Routines (Unit 5)

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Lecture 8 – Daily Routines

Students learn present simple for routines.

Verbs:

Wake up, Eat, Study, Work, Sleep.

Examples:

I wake up at 7.

I study English.

She works in a hospital.

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Lecture 9 – Likes and Free Time

Students talk about hobbies and likes.

Grammar: Like / Don't like

Examples:

I like football.

I don't like coffee.

She likes music.

Vocabulary:

Bank, School, Hospital, Restaurant, Street.

Prepositions:

In, On, Next to, Opposite.

Examples:

The bank is next to the school.

The café is on the street.
