Lecture 1

Unit 1 – Present Simple – Form, Use, and Practice

The Present Simple tense is used to describe daily routines, habits, general facts, and permanent situations.

Form: With I/You/We/They we use the base verb. With He/She/It we add -s or -es.

Example: She works in a hospital.

Negative: Subject + do/does not + base verb.

Question: Do/Does + subject + base verb?

Common time expressions: always, usually, often, every day.

Unit 1 – Adverbs of Frequency

Adverbs of frequency describe how often an action happens.

Examples: always, usually, often, sometimes, never.

Position: Before the main verb, after verb to be.

Example: She always drinks coffee.

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Lecture 3

Unit 2 – Present Continuous

Used for actions happening now or temporary situations.

Form: Subject + am/is/are + verb+ing.

Example: They are studying English now.

Signal words: now, at the moment.

Unit 2 – Present Simple vs Present Continuous

Present Simple: habits and permanent facts.

Present Continuous: actions happening now.

Example: I live in Baghdad. / I am living with my friend this month.

Unit 3 – Past Simple – Regular Verbs

Used for finished actions in the past.

Regular verbs end with -ed (worked, visited).

Time expressions: yesterday, last week.

Unit 3 – Past Simple – Irregular Verbs

Irregular verbs change form (go-went, see-saw).

Question: Did + subject + base verb?

Unit 4 – Countable and Uncountable Nouns

Countable nouns: books, apples.

Uncountable nouns: water, rice, money.

Use some/any correctly.

Unit 4 – Quantifiers – Much, Many, A lot of
Many with countable nouns.

Much with uncountable nouns.

A lot of with both.

Unit 5 – Future with Going to

Used for future plans and intentions.

Form: am/is/are + going to + base verb.

Unit 5 – Will – Predictions and Decisions

Used for predictions and instant decisions.

Form: will + base verb.
